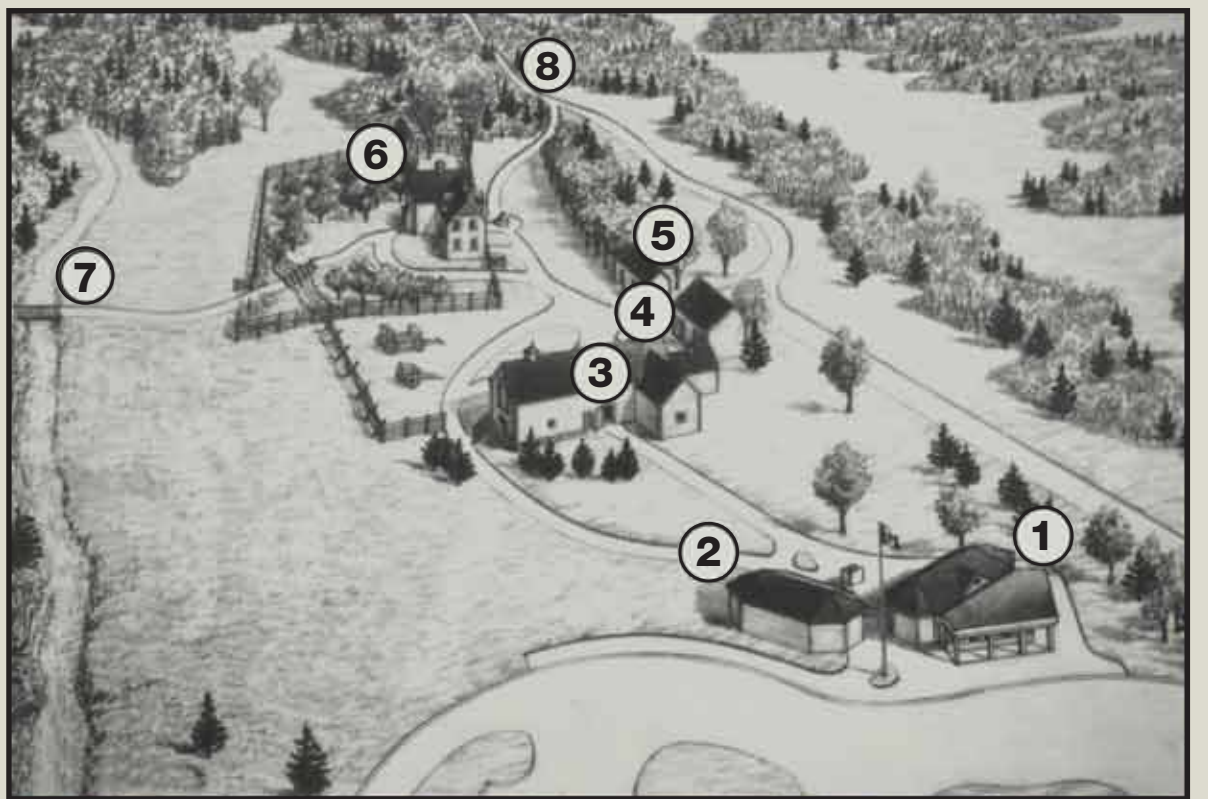

Haunted Wood Trail - 0.9 km Return. This old spruce grove was a favourite haunt of L. M. Montgomery. She and her friends invented the Haunted Wood and told blood curdling tales of ghosts that might be found there. Watch for the sign that points to The Site of L. M. Montgomery's Cavendish Home. Follow the lane to the site of the quaint homestead where the author lived with her grandparents and wrote *Anne of Green Gables*. Please note that separate admission fees apply; combination fees are available.

Balsam Hollow Trail - 0.8 km Return. This trail begins on an old cow path named by the author: Lover's Lane. Montgomery thought it was a very romantic spot. Continue onto the Balsam Hollow trail which wanders through mixed woodlands and follows a babbling brook.
