Main Jasper Connector Revived **Old Fort Point Bridge renewed**

A major \$1 million dollar replacement of the Old Fort Point bridge was completed in October 2013. Old Fort Point is a Jasper classic hike with spectacular views of the townsite and surrounding areas. Visitors can also connect from here on foot or bike to the spectacular Lac Beauvert trail.

A New Place to Cross Country Ski and Snowshoe **Equipped with a warming hut and much more**

New cross country and snowshoeing trails are being constructed in a new area of the park 25km west of Jasper. The new Decoigne will feature a rustic warming hut, group size campfire pit, new washrooms and of course- new trails! Pronounced "Duh-coin", the area rich in human history and wildlife.

Re-opened Cavell Road **After a dramatic summer 2012**

There is no better location to experience a dramatic landscape change. The Ghost Glacier fell on August 8th/2012 and caused a flood of debris that washed out hiking trails, picnic tables and forced the road to close. Re-opened in spring of 2013, this stunning area features an adjusted trail network and boasts one of Jasper's most accessible alpine areas and top attractions.
