Cell phone coverage is variable throughout the park. Do not rely on it. Let someone know where you are going before you start your adventure.

**Protect us from pests**

Keep our forest safe by not moving firewood. There could be invasive pests - like the emerald ash borer - hiding in the wood. Wasagaming campers can purchase firewood at the campground.

**Aquatic Invasive Species**





- Keep a safe distance from all wildlife. If an animal notices you by lifting its head, looking at you or listening to you, you are too close and should back away.
- Travelling in groups and making noise will let wildlife know you are nearby.
- Late summer and early fall is elk and moose mating season; be especially aware of wildlife along trails at this time.
- **Do not feed wildlife;** they have a greater rate of survival and are healthier when they feed on natural food.
- Keep your pet on a leash and under physical control at all times. Dogs can provoke defensive behaviour in bears and other wildlife.
- Read the Bear Aware brochures, available at any park facility.









- Deep Lake - 113 km / approximately 90 minutes
