Program descriptions

The Wolves and Elk of the RMNP Region

Interpreters lead groups of students through a lecture and field excursion in the Lake Audy area of the Park. Students are actively engaged in research and monitoring using radio telemetry.
Grades 9-12 Program length: 2-3 hours

The Beavers of the RMNP Region

In the field students will monitor and learn about the diversity of these "ecosystem engineers" provide to the surrounding landscape and some of the issues facing management of wild and not so wild spaces.
Grades 9- 12 Program length: 2 hours.
