^{*}Groups must come with Group Leaders (one point of contact for The Leader of Volunteer Engagement and other Parks Canada staff to work with efficiently). Groups larger than 55 are subject to sub-division (to ensure minimum impact to the environment, Parks Canada may also work with local partners to co-deliver large group programs).

Want to dig deeper ...?

1. **INSURANCE:** Parks Canada's Volunteer Program Insurance covers volunteers who sign a Group Volunteer Form. It is recommended that formal groups have insurance as well. We will require all participants' names; and they must be between 18 and 90 years of age, (under 18, parental or guardian signatures are required, as is adult supervision / leadership).



- 2. MATERIALS & TRAINING: Will be supplied. Please wear comfortable closed-toed shoes suitable for walking and working in, and dress for the weather (layers are always good). Be prepared with snacks and water.
- 3. **COSTS:** There is no fee for participating in these stewardship activities, however <u>donations are gratefully accepted</u> (ask us how it works: you can specify what Banff National Park program you want your contribution to support, for example: wildlife research, habitat restoration, trail work, educational programs, etc.)
- 4. **PARK PRESENTATIONS:** It may be possible to arrange for a Parks Canada expert to speak to your group about Banff's natural or cultural heritage, for a fee please ask.
- 5. **PARK PASS:** All participants must have a valid park pass to enter the park. Park pass fees are used to protect the park and to provide visitor facilities and services, so please consider supporting Parks Canada in this way as well. Group rates are available here.
- 6. **Due to increasing demand** in group volunteer engagement in the park, and other factors such as weather and wildlife, we will work hard to meet your requests but there is no guarantee. We recommend you have a back-up plan in case your volunteer activity is cancelled. We also reserve the right to prioritize group bookings based on our priorities and needs.
